

BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2012-014a: AN ORDINANCE TO BE A PART OF THE SALARY  
ORDINANCE FOR DELAWARE COUNTY PART-TIME EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Delaware County Council to fix the compensation of the officers, deputies and other employees whose compensation is payable from the county general fund, county highway fund, or any other fund from which the Delaware County Auditor issues warrants for compensation; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Delaware County Council to define and adopt a Part-Time Job Classification for persons performing part-time work and to amend said Part-Time Job Classification from time to time as deemed necessary; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend the Part-Time Job Classification system to add an additional classification that will allow for specialized services with concomitant pay rates for the Delaware County building commissioner, emergency medical technicians and paramedics.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the County Council of Delaware County, Indiana, as follows:


Section 1. That the Part-Time Job Classification system, as set forth in Ordinance 2012-014a, shall be amended and supplemented by adding a classification as follows:


- g. Part Time 7
  - i. Types of Jobs and Pay Rates: emergency medical technicians at \$15.00 per hour; building commissioner at \$16.00 per hour; paramedics at \$20.00 per hour.
  - ii. High school or GED and advanced education and/or degree required, minimum 3 years previous applicable experience required.


Section 2. That this Ordinance shall be effective upon adoption by the Delaware County Council and such publication as required by law.


